offertory gifts at the Mass celebrated by Pope Francis at the Cathedral Basilica of SS. Peter and Paul on Sept. 26, he will lead his family by example. For Davis, a retired executive from Sunoco, that indelible example was given to him by his own father, Isaac Davis, many years ago. "I was the youngest in a family of 10 children; my mother died when I was 3 and my father raised us," he said. The family lived in West Philadelphia and Isaac

Davis was a laborer with the Baldwin Locomotive Works who, whenever he could, started his day with Mass at St. James Church two blocks

away from their home. Unfailingly a hallmark of his evening was the recitation of the rosary, during which he prayed for each of his children by name. "He gave us love," Davis said. "He helped us to understand

we need a spiritual base in life." In a certain sense his dad was more of a grandfather figure who kept the household running on an even keel, with the eldest children pitching in to help raise the little ones. There wasn't much money in the house, but they didn't think of themselves as poor. The father and the older children would sacrifice, for example, to see that the little ones had Christmas gifts. After attending St. James School Davis went on to West Catholic High School. To earn a bit of money he would clean at St. James School in the late afternoon then after dinner work at the parish rectory. It was a big rectory then, with as many as seven priests, including some who might be attending the University of Pennsylvania. This cemented what has been a life-long respect for priests. "They treated me like a son," Davis said. He continued this work after he entered La Salle College. Financially it was a challenge, but thanks to his parish work and a bit of help from his family he made it. Growing up as a mentor for him was his brother Charles, who joined the Marines and was severely wounded in Korea. It was touch and go, but after a long recuperation Charles did recover.








all student athletes that ever represented West Catholic High School in their chosen sport or more over the 95+ years of its existence. The wheel is turning round and round and Where it will stop? I will tell you, it is the fall of 1960a very exciting period and the year that our 35thPresident of the United States, John F. Kennedy, age 43 (Democrat) defeated Richard T. Nixon, age 47(Republican) on Tuesday, November 8, 1960 with an Electoral College Victory of 303 to 219 but with only a very slim Popular Vote difference of 49.7% to 49.6% representing a difference of 112,827 Votes that represented one of the closest elections in generations. While this Presidential Election couldn't be any closer with the Popular Vote, the 1960 BURR football season proved to be very competitive. Tom Dorrian, Sports Editor of the West Catholic NEWS that year recalls that this team was very much underrated before the Philadelphia Catholic Season began. Led by Co-Captains

(according to the 1961 blue and white) West foils foes...for a surprising second place finish. For the record, the 1960 BURRS were victorious in six league contests, with two ties and only one defeat. They also were victorious on Thanksgiving Day with a 49-16 win over Bartram High School the neighborhood rival. This 1960 Squad outscored their opponents 231 to 92and missed out on any chance at the Championship before their last League game, with two tie games against LaSalle 0-0 and Bonner, 14-14. No matter what they did against Bishop Neumann there was no chance of finishing any higher than second which they did. Spoke with Tom De Fiore recently who helped with details about this Season. When West Catholic went up against LaSalle, in the 0-0 Game, They did so without starting Offensive Linemen, Tom Bazis, Tom De Fiore and Bill Schumacher who were out with injuries. The Coaching staff for the 1960 team included Vince & John McAneney, Bernie



Nominees for the Bishop McCort Award do NOT have to be graduates of West Catholic. 50th Anniversary Golden Burr Award: A nominee must (a) be a Catholic gentleman; (b) be amember of the 50 year anniversary class of West Catholic (the Class of 1966); (c) be a proven "loyal son" of West Catholic; (d) have achieved outstanding success in a chosen field of endeavor; and (e) have contributed significantly to

West Catholic in any form. 25th Anniversary Golden Burr Award: A nominee must (a) be a Catholic gentleman; (b) be a member of the 25 year anniversary class of West Catholic (the Class of 1991); (c) be a proven "loyal son" of West Catholic; (d) have achieved outstanding success in a chosen field of endeavor; and (e) have contributed significantly to West Catholic in any form.



Greetings from the Principal's Office! Mr. Jim Gallagher



I hope that the summer was a good one for all of you and your families, filled with much fun and relaxation in whatever form that takes! As my term begins, I am amazed by the extent to which this amazing family reaches and how warm so many of you have been in welcoming me as a new member. As this journey has begun, I have noticed just how much of my life is "connected" to the West Catholic and Christian Brothers communities. My first exposure to West Catholic dates back to my elementary school days growing up Robert in Reading, PA. McLennan ('55) was a friend of my parents and we were travelling down to the Palestra

for a Big 5 doubleheader. Back then, most of us in Reading were unfamiliar with the happenings in Philadelphia: to me, Philadelphia was just a place we had to drive through to get to Ocean City, NJ for our summer vacations. But Mr. McLennan spoke fondly of parishes, neighborhoods and his days at West. proud history to be valued and treasured. The students of today are focused on their studies and activities, as they should be during the exciting year ahead at West Catholic Prep. Since the fall of 1989 when West Catholic High School opened the school year as a coeducational High School at 45th & Chestnut Street following the closing of both West Philadelphia Catholic High School for Boys' and West Philadelphia Catholic High School for Girls' after graduationin June of 1989. Both of the original High Schools opened their doors nearly 100 years ago, West Boys' opened in September of 1916 and West Girls' did so in September of 1927. The Boys' were at 49th & Chestnut while the Girls' were only four blocks away at 45th & Chestnut, the current home of West Prep. Since most of my experience connects to the first 75 + years, I hope to help you remember many of those who contributed to the success of BURR LAND during those wonderful years. Father Walter C. Tredtin, S.M. 1916-1921, West Catholic Boys' first Principal, Peter J. Mooney, President, John J. Driscoll, Vice President and William J. Dunn, Secretary, Class Officers Class of 1920. The first year of classes for the young BURRS of West Philadelphia Catholic High School for Boys' 1916-1917 were completed at the Transfiguration Parish School on Cedar Avenue in

West Catholic Prep has a West Philadelphia. Other key contributors to the success of this first year were Brother Joseph Jenning, S.M. and BrotherAloysius Ebert, S.M. The second Principal, Father John Ott, S.M. served from 1921-1926. Not until 1926 did the Christian Brothers begin to make their mark on this outstanding Catholic High School for Boys'. As reported in 1992 in The West Catholic Story, Brother Kevin Stanton, F.S.C.,'56 wrote that in September of 1926 a new religious community prepared to assume direction of the school. The Brothers of Mary, who had conducted West Catholic until that time, found it necessary to transfer their Brothers to other assignments. They were succeeded by the Brothers of the Christian Schools, under the leadership of Brother E. Anselm Murphy, F.S.C. Under the direction of the Christian Brothers their student population increased from the opening year of 110 students, until it reached a peak of 2,875in 1952. This number included freshmen year annexes in several West Philadelphia, and suburban parishes. Brother Kevin also reported that West Catholic Boys' tradition is extraordinary not so much for its length as it is for the quality of its administrators and teachers, along with the unique spirit they fostered. Ask any alumnus from 49th & Chestnut about West Catholic, and he will reminisce about the personal concern of his former teachers as well as the

companionship shared with fellow students in class and extracurricular activities. We are fortunate that Brother Kevin (Principal from 1970-1973) continues today to spread the special spirit of theChristian Brothers. Just as former Principals did during the earlier days at Burr Land. They include Brother E. James, (1932-1937), Brother E. Abdon, 1937-1938, Brother Francis de Sales, 1938-1941, Brother E. Paul, 1947-1950, Brother David Henry, 1950-1954; Brother G. John, 1954-1962. Let us remember them and help the West Catholic of today (West Prep) to continue, flourish and grow. Did you know the Boys' basketball team of 1920-21 was the first West Catholic Boys' team to win a Catholic League Championship? Another first happened in 1943 when the undefeated BURR football team became the first in school history to capture the City of Philadelphia Football Championship outright with a 21-0 victory over the Public school Champ, Northeast High School at Franklin Field. Yes, we all remember the good days when both West Boys' and West Girls' were in their prime. As the 100 year Anniversary of West Boys' nears...Let us remember to support Catholic Education by helping West Prep through the Alumni Association.

The violin's chance to be again came August 13th, 2015 when Regina Benecke, age 96, a resident of Sterling Nursing and Rehabiliatation center in Media, PA presented the violin to Dave Joslin, Jr., President of the West Catholic Alumni Association. It was Regina's wish that a current student at her alma mater have a chance to make music with her sister's violin.

Regina, a member of the class of 1936, was Regina Hughes when she attended the high school. She played piano but her older sister, Margaret Hughes, who passed away in 1975, played the violin. The sisters grew up in Minersville,

PA and the family moved to Philadelphia in 1928. REgina remembers her parents, Margaret and Arthur Hughes buying the violin in the 1920's.

We loved to play music. I knew it was somewhere in my house. I was so glad when my granddaughter found the violin," Regina said. "It's in good shape and it will be wonderfull to know someone will play it again."

The violin case has fallen apart, the strings and bridge need to be replaced but the instrument is in good condition, she said.
