Mass will begin at 9:00 a.m. Breakfast and the awards ceremony will be immediately following. Ticket prices are \$25.00 in advance or at the door.

Our principal celebrant will be the Reverend Richard J. McAndrews. A member of the Golden Anniversary Class of 1958 Father McAndrews attended St. Charles Borromeo Seminary and has served the members of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia through positions in many parishes. Currently, he is the pastor of Epiphany of Our Lord Parish in Plymouth Meeting. Father McAndrews also has a Masters Degree from LaSalle University.

Brother Kevin Stanton, FSC, will be our homilist. After graduating from West Catholic in 1956, Brother Kevin obtained his BA from LaSalle University; he also received a Masters Degree from the University of Notre Dame. Brother has held many teaching and administrative positions through out the Christian Brothers' ministries, including Principal of West Catholic and President of Calvert Hall. Currently, he is teaching at St. Gabriel's Hall, Audubon, Pennsylvania.

Once again, deserving alumni of West Catholic will be honored for their many accomplishments and contributions to West Catholic, the Alumni Association and society in general. Members of our 50 year class—the Class of 1958 —will receive special awards and will be involved in various aspects of the Mass.

The Alumni Association is continuing the new tradition started last year by also honoring the Silver Anniversary Class—the Class of 1983.

All priest-alumni are invited to serve as concelebrants for this special occasion. Special arrangements are being made to provide a beautiful musical program for the liturgy.

All activities on November 4th will take place at the Springfield Country Club. Because of the large attendance last year, the Mass will be celebrated in a separate, larger room within the Club in recognition of the solemnity of the occasion. All proceeds from the Offertory Collection will be used for the Communion Breakfast fund to benefit Catholic students who wish to attend West Catholic.

The Communion Breakfast was moved to Springfield Country Club last year for many reasons, including making it more convenient for the majority of alumni to attend, since more Alumni live in Delaware County than any other county, including Philadelphia. Last year's enthusiastic and large attendance demonstrated the popularity of this change.

Over 1,900 persons have dedicated their lives to serving the Lord since graduating from West Catholic High School. This distinguished group includes Sisters, Christian Brothers, Priests, six Bishops and Cardinal John O'Connor '38. Over 180 returned to West on April 25, 2007 to attend a reunion Mass and social. It was the first time than many had been back to the school since graduation.

The idea for the unique celebration came from the Rev. David Engo, the school's Chaplain. The homilist for the Mass, Rev. Msg. James T. McDonough '49, urged students to give careful consideration to a religious life. Brother Timothy Ahern, School President, was surprised by the turnout and suggested that the large number of religious graduates may be a record for any Catholic high school in America. Students, staff and teachers all attended this joyful reunion.

Successful Fund Drive Comes To A Close

The 2007 Fund Campaign ended on September 30th and raised a substantial amount in response to the two appeals mailed to all alumni. Co-chairmen Thomas A. Bazis, '62 and Clifford Roberson, M.D., '71 reported that the final total will amount to just over \$90,000.

Brothers' Boys Share An Afternoon With a West Catholic Legend

On April 21, 2007, members of the Class of 1954 shared a unique experience at The University of LaSalle in Philadelphia. Twenty members of that class had the honor and a rare opportunity to eat lunch and reminisce about many pleasant memories with none other than Brother John Owens, AKA "Handsome John," "Hanse," "Brother John", or "Brother West Catholic". He is now retired and living at LaSalle.

If you attended West Catholic Boys High School during the years from 1939 through 1963, you knew him either as a teacher or as the Principal, and he knew you. If you didn't know him, you obviously did not go to West. After the luncheon, with his Irish wit as sharp as ever, Brother John fielded many questions from the twenty Burrs in attendance.

The son of a policeman from the tough Fairmount section of Philadelphia, Brother John has many admirable qualities, but his unique trait is an amazing memory. He can recall events and names not only from his years at West but also from his early childhood. It was a treat to hear his many stories, as well as those of his former students. with a twinkle in his still clear blue eyes, Brother shared many antidotes about his teaching experiences, which had the "Brothers' Boys" laughing.

Of course, all former Burrs can recall those piercing blue eyes when they were not laughing. Who else could

quiet an auditorium full of rambunctious teenage boys by merely entering the area? One glare from those eyes and every student lost the power to make a sound. No student ever wanted to meet The "Handsome One" about a discipline problem either, although Brother John was always fair in his judgment and in meeting out the appropriate punishment for the student's infraction.

Each member of the '54 class had one or more stories about the guest of honor. Surely, all who ever came in contact with Brother John have favorite personal memories.

Class president, Gus Hoban, and fellow '54 classmates, George Weir and Don 'Squeeze' Campbell, were instrumental in arranging this pleasant afternoon. Brother Gerry Molineaux, West '53, and Sid MacLeod, both of the Communications Department at LaSalle University, were gracious, as well as instrumental, in having the guestion and answer session with Brother John recorded and put on a DVD. Although only those from the class of '54 were in attendance, we are certain that other classes will enjoy viewing the sixty-three minute disk, which is available through George Light at the Alumni Office. William A. Sheridan, EdD'43, Deceased By: Ed Kerr, Jr.,'60

Bill Sheridan from the great class of 1943 has passed and he will be missed. Hailing from MBS parish, Bill would serve his country in the United States Army during World War II following graduation from West Catholic High School for Boys'. He was awarded two Purple Hearts in the name of the President of the United States for his service to his country during war time. Following the war, Bill would attend LaSalle College and continue his education with the Christian Brothers. He loved being an Educator and would earn a Doctorate in this field.

Bill, and his wonderful wife Josephine, have two children, William F. and Beth, they also have eight grandchildren. After his years of service to the Philadelphia School District as a School Principal, Bill Sheridan would turn his efforts and service to his beloved West Catholic High School for Boys'. He served as Alumni Association President for two terms and also initiated the Bob Dougherty Sports Hall of Fame for West Catholic High School Athletics during the 1980's. He fought to keep West Catholic High School for Boys' open, while supporting the new school once it opened in the fall of 1989. Together with J. Howard McCaffrey, his classmate at West Catholic, he got the ball rolling for the annual BURRS at the BEACH celebration.

His commitment to his alma mater was recognized by the Alumni Association when he was signaled out with an award at the annual Communion Breakfast a few years ago. Bill's service should be remembered and embraced by younger BURR graduates who can afford their time and skills to help West Catholic students of today.

Henry C. 'Shag' Crawford, '35, Deceased

Shag Crawford, 90, a National League Baseball Umpire for two decades from Havertown PA and the Class of 1935, died in July. He umpired in the majors from 1956 to 1975. Shag worked three World Series, two National League Championship Series and three All Star Games.

When umpiring at home plate, he crouched especially close so that he could view pitches, his hand resting on the catcher's back to keep his balance. All Burrs who follow Major League Baseball were proud of fellow Burr, Shag and his association with the game.



Keeping Track of Coach Franklin Harwell

It was early September of 1991 when my Dad introduced me to Coach Franklin Harwell. I was a freshman at West Catholic who hadn't given much thought to joining one of West's athletic teams. One day, I found myself in Coach Harwell's office looking to be a part of the crosscountry team. I was a bit heavier back then and not fast by any means, but, to my surprise, Coach welcomed me to the team and told me to come to the first practice. Although I never competed in a single cross-country event, I always practiced and was a part of the team. Once indoor track season began, Coach believed that the shotput was a better event for me than a relay and he was right. To Coach Harwell, we were more than just his team, we were his children. If you happened to be on one of his teams between 1982 and 1996, then you know that there was a family atmosphere and everyone cared for one another. One thing we learned early on was that laziness was never tolerated. If you were in pain, you didn't 'find a stump to fit your rump' and Coach definitely never wanted to see any 'shuckin' and jivin'.' Coach always had his trusty megaphone, stopwatch and whistle at every practice. After each of those practices, you'd feel like you had just competed, but you were ready for when the real thing came along. To Coach Harwell, it didn't matter if we won or lost. What mattered was that we finished and did our best.

A graduate of Overbrook High School in 1947, Harwell ran on the Philadelphia Public High Championship crosscountry team in 1947 and on the 2-mile relay championship teams of 1946 and 1947. In 1982, he joined West Catholic as the Assistant Bowling Coach at the boys' school. Come 1984, he took on the role of Head Coach of both the cross-country and track and field teams. When you were on a Coach Harwell team, you learned the importance of self respect, respect for others, getting a good education and finishing what you started. We weren't just being prepared for the next meet, we were being prepared for the rest of our lives. After accepting an Assistant Coach position at Temple University in 1996, Coach didn't sever ties with West Catholic. He continued in a role that he was no stranger to...mentor. He served as a counselor and supervisor for the after school tutoring program until 2005.

Today, Coach Harwell is retired from coaching, but West Catholic still holds a special place in his heart. "West became like a family to me. I was treated so nice by students, faculty and the alumni association. A lot of people were just good to me. Above all, I had the best students."

Being on one of his teams didn't just mean that you had to give your best in competition; you also had to do your best in the classroom. Academics always came first. If you were struggling, Coach Harwell would have another young men and women of West Catholic. You have been a true father figure and friend to so many of us and you are a genuine class act. The school was a better place thanks to your contributions which will never be forgotten.

teammate tutor you to help you improve. Some days he would tell some of his team members that they were being given the day off from practice to be tutored. Coach Harwell added that, "The team took care of each other. They learned how to sit down and talk to each other. How you treated your fellow teammates was what mattered to us." In addition to providing tutors, Coach would also bring in guest speakers and help students get financial assistance information if they were pursuing higher education. He did not have an easy life growing up and added, "I believed I could be a great asset to them because of where I came from."

These days, still a Philadelphia resident, Coach Harwell says with a laugh, "All I want to do is relax!" His granddaughter began her freshman year at Agnes Irwin School in Rosemont, PA this fall and plans to run track and cross-country. She has asked him for some help. Luckily, her grandfather has some experience in those sports. As for his many former team members, Coach Harwell enjoys keeping in touch with a number of his West Catholic "children." He says, "As long as I'm here, they can always call me and are always welcome in my home." Every so often, I will receive a note from Coach with a couple of pictures from my days on the crosscountry and track teams. His notes have always been signed, 'Love you son' which also shows how much he cares.

Looking back on twentythree years of service to the school, he says, "I'm so happy West Catholic gave me the opportunity to be a part of their lives as much as they were a part of mine. I love West Catholic." Thank you Coach Harwell for all of your years of dedication to the young men and women of West Catholic. You have been a true father figure and friend to so many of us and you are a genuine class act. The school was a better place which will never be forgotten.

IN MEMORIAM FATHER EDWARD J. FLANIGAN, M.M. 1929 - 2007

Father Edward J. Flanigan, '47 died at Phelps Memorial Hospital, Sleepy Hollow, New York on June 30, 2007. He was 78 years old and a Maryknoll priest for 51 years.

Edward James Flanigan was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on June 25, 1929, son of Edward and Regina Murphy Flanigan. He is the oldest of five children: his sisters are Maureen, (Sister Regina) of the Immaculate Heart of Mary community in Philadelphia, who spent many years on the IHM missions in Chile and Peru, and Dr. Eleanor, professor of computer science at Montclair State University in New Jersey. Both brothers are physicians, Richard a cardiologist in Denver, Colorado and Donald, a radiologist in Santa Barbara, California.

He attended Good Shepherd and Most Blessed Sacrament elementary schools and West Philadelphia Catholic High School for Boys. He entered Maryknoll in September 1946 and received a B.A. degree in Philosophy in 1951, an S.T.B. in 1955, and a Master's degree in Religious Education in 1956.

Father Flanigan was ordained at Maryknoll, New York on June 9, 1956. He then sailed to his mission assignment with the Chinese people on the island of Formosa, now Taiwan. Following language study, he spent the early years in pastoral work in the mission of Chu Shan



where, with the help of Stateside friends, he built a new village church named St. Anne's in the Fields and also worked in the large mission of Tien Chung where he helped with the existing goiter eradication program for many affected people in the area. In 1962, after advanced Chinese studies at the University of Pennsylvania, he was assigned as pastor of St. Patrick's Mission of Feng-Yuan, where he worked for the next 12 years. During that time he built a convent for the native Taiwanese sisters, established a county-wide nutrition program for underprivileged children, formed two councils of the Legion of Mary and conducted many parish outreach groups.

In the mid-70's Father Flanigan was assigned to the U.S. and the Society Development Department, working in Los Angeles and New Jersey. On his return to Taiwan in July 1977, he helped complete a common usage English-Amoy Chinese dictionary, and he worked among the mountain aboriginal

tribes in Central Taiwan. In 1980, due to a large influx of Chinese students to Hawaii, he was assigned to a term as chaplain at the University of Hawaii and the East-West Center in Honolulu. When he returned to Taiwan, he was involved in family ministry in Maryknoll's Friendship House in the capital city of Taipei.

In 1986 Father Flanigan was assigned as pastor of Holy Cross mission in Changhua City, central Taiwan, which included pastoral care for two large hospitals, Changhua Christian and SiuThoan. Due to a stroke suffered in the mission there, he was only able to remain a few years and was forced to return to the states for 2 years of intensive stroke rehabilitation at the Society Center at Maryknoll, New York. In 1990 he was able to return to Taiwan, where he served as Director of the Maryknoll Chinese Language School in Taichung, and has been responsible over the past 15 years for the compilation of an Amoy Chinese-English dictionary and the publication of a book of hundreds of common usage Taiwanese proverbs. Due to medical reasons, Father Flanigan returned to the U.S. in the spring of 2005 and took up residence at St. Teresa's.

Fr. Flanigan is survived by his two sisters - Sr. Regina Edwards IHM, Dr. Eleanor Flanigan and his two brothers - Drs. Richard and Donald.

1943 CATHOLIC AND CITY FOOTBALL CHAMPIONS

Too many years have passed for us not to mention the great West Catholic football team of 1943. This squad was the first football team from West Catholic to capture both the Catholic & City Championships. Going undefeated with a perfect 10-0 record is something that all graduates of West Catholic should be proud of. This team scored 324 points while their opponents could only garner 58, the 10-0 record also includes three shutouts against LaSalle, Roman Catholic and Northeast High for the City of Philadelphia Championship before 35,000 fans at Franklin Field on the campus of the

University of Pennsylvania.

Led by their beloved Head coach Bob Dougherty and his key assistant, Bill McCoy this green inexperienced team was molded into world beaters by the coaching skill of Bob Dougherty...as reported in the 1944 West Catholic yearbook. With only three seasoned players returning, the Burrs were not given much of a chance of capping the crown in 1943.

Major contributors to this great team included John



Peter Murphey was the right tackle and Joe Topper, played opposite at left tackle. Tom Van Klrk, was at the center and Charles Ward at left guard while John McCoach at right guard completed the starting eleven that outscored their opponents by an average of nearly 27 points during this undefeated Championship season. Other contributors to this eventful season included Jack Convery, Robert Keily, George

McAndrews, Joe Dougherty, John Diver, Jim King, John Hennessey, Dan Gallagher, Francis Kirkman, Leonard Hope and Francis Mullarkey. Peter Murphey had a superb season as the point after specialist, and was perfect on that Championship day against Northeast High. 1943 a year to remember and a team to celebrate one more time. These undefeated young Burr men of the gridiron certainly contributed to the proud history of West Catholic Athletics and the legend continues with the Burrs of today under their head coach, Brian Fluck and his Championship Burrs of 2006.


